#### President's Report

- <u>Camera/Lock Quote:</u> The installation of the camera is confirmed to be starting the week after Labor Day. She is waiting to hear back on auto lock quotes; she has e-mailed and called.
- <u>BMO</u>: We have provided them with updated information for signature cards. Items that need to continue to be followed up on include QR codes for payment, credit card application for church, process to have treasurer have online access to statements, have BMO look into fraud related to Mission Trip.
- MSP Review: Had meeting with two pastors to review our MSP to get their perspective and sent those notes to the chair of
  the call committee.
- <u>Centralize information</u>: Working with Dawn Van Keulen and Chris Pesch on application for Microsoft Office.
- <u>Council and Executive</u>: Communication on information received and coordinated with new council member.
- <u>Bell Tower</u>: Reviewed report of work completed and last bid for roof approved.
- Review Resources for Congregation: Researched options. Set up and attended meeting with Reverend Peter Soli and reviewing proposal. Synod also has "coaching."

## Treasurer's Report

- <u>Bills</u>: Bills for the month of September were sent out prior to the meeting for review. Total General Fund bills are estimated at \$8,840.69 with two additional bills: copyright license for music and VBS T-shirts.
- Motion made by Terri Myhre to approve the Treasurer's Report. Jasmine DeSmet seconded the motion. Motion carried.

#### **Board of Trustees Report**

- <u>Bills</u>: Total General Fund bills are estimated at \$8,840.6 with two additional bills: copyright license for music and VBS T-shirts. The estimate for the VBS counselors is \$2,000; we budgeted \$4,000, so we will come in well under budget on this. **Motion made by Cory Myhre to approve payment of bills. Barb Knutson seconded the motion. Motion carried.**
- <u>Building Committee</u>: We have had several people volunteer for the Building Committee. Jason Johnson will be the chairperson, and Jeff Van Keulen, Fran Fier, Gene Fodness, and Lynn Okrina have volunteered to be on the committee. They will meet prior to the budget meeting prior to the annual meeting to provide recommendations on things that need to be addressed. Motion made by Sandy Josephson to approve the building committee members. Deb Belaen seconded the motion. Motion carried.

### **Church Council Notes (continued)**

- <u>"God's Work, Our Hands"</u>: This day is always the same weekend as Boxelder Bug Days. It was agreed that we should set a date and start advertising for both volunteers and those who need help. It was agreed that we schedule it for October 12<sup>th</sup>. Jenn won't be here that day, so we will look at doing a "Let It Shine" service. We can have a light lunch provided, also.
- <u>Invite a Friend</u>: This opportunity was listed in the September newsletter, and there are postcards available starting September 14 to invite a friend to church.
- <u>Constitutional Amendment</u>: Amie printed out items from the model constitution and each board is asked to review their sections to compare what is in our current constitution versus what we are actually doing and what is in the model constitution. For example, our current constitution calls for a Financial Secretary, but we don't do it currently.
- <u>Council Meeting via E-mail Feedback</u>: Overall, it went well, and everyone was willing to try it again. The goal is that if we have bad weather, we can do it this way or do a Zoom call. We can also look at doing this in the summer when people are not available in person.
- Reverend Peter Scoli: Peter Scoli is a former pastor who does consulting with congregations. He worked with Granite Falls when they had two pastors leave in quick succession and were also combining with another congregation. The executive committee met with him previously on a consultation; he asked a lot of good questions, like what does success look like for us? There are several different options available with costs ranging from \$2,500 to \$7,500; onsite programming is \$950 per day. There was additional discussion about costs and what services he would provide.
  - Follow-ups: Amie will follow up on what money is available from the synod for this type of program. She will also follow up to get a few dates where he could meet with the full council via Zoom or Teams.
- Motion made by Barb Knutson to approve the Board of Trustees' report. Emily Hennen seconded the motion. Motion carried.

#### **Board of Deacons Report**

- Walk Around Offerings: 4th Sunday of the month Endowment matches walk around offerings 2:1 up to \$500.
  - September 28– Minneota Public Schools for school supplies needed by students whose families are unable to purchase the requested items.
  - October 19 Hope Harbor
- <u>Communion Dates</u>:
  - September Communion will be on September 14 and September 28.
  - October Communion will be on October 5 and October 26 (Confirmation Sunday).
- Terri Myhre made a motion to approve the Board of Deacons. Angie DeVos seconded the motion. Motion carried.

#### **Board of Education Report**

- <u>Mission Trip Fundraising</u>: Food at Football has started. They will be serving BBQ's at the vendor show during Boxelder Bug Days. There will also be mission trip apparel available again this year.
- GLOW:
  - Sunday, September 14th is the kickoff, and Porcia Baxter will be the speaker on Building Disciples.
  - Wednesday, September 17th is the first night of GLOW.
- <u>Confirmation</u>: The large group will be led by Terri Myhre, and the small groups will be led by Cory Myhre and Adam Hoffman. There are 2 students from Bethany-Elim who will be joining our confirmation this year.
  - October 19th at 5:30 pm will be Statement of Faith night
  - October 26th at 10:00 am is Confirmation; there are 8 students being confirmed.
- Youth of Hope: Angle and Terri have agreed to be Youth of Hope leaders.
  - Service Projects Prairie Home Hospice sets up Independence Park, and the Youth of Hope may help with that.
- <u>Upcoming Dates</u>: Confirmation will be October 26, and the Christmas program will be December 14th.
- Motion made by Angie DeVos to approve the Board of Education report. Jen Anderson seconded the motion. Motion carried.

#### **Other Business**

- <u>BMO</u>: The bank may be able to get some money back on the Mission Trip fraud.
- <u>Call Committee Update</u>: We had received one name, but she had already accepted another call. In August there were 2 candidates who asked to look at our MSP.
- <u>Grant Proposal</u>: We had put in a grant proposal to the synod for Youth in Motion, and we just received notification that we were rewarded \$3,000. Additional paperwork will be completed prior to receiving the funds, but that is great news!
- Motion made by Deb Belaen to adjourn. Angie DeVos seconded the motion. Motion carried.

## Council President's Report - September 2025

While this past month was a bit quieter from a Church Council perspective, our **youth ministries were full** of life and activity!

My husband and I continue to teach the Preschool–Kindergarten class, and we've had a fun and meaningful start to the year. One of our first lessons was about building our lives on a strong foundation, based on the parable of the wise and foolish builders. To help our little ones connect with the message, we created "houses" using marshmallows and chocolate kisses—some built on "sand" (pudding), and others on "rock" (Oreos with frosting). After the story, we discussed strong and weak ways to act, helping the children understand how making good choices starts with a solid foundation in faith. It should be of no surprise that they enjoyed the lesson and needed a bit of cleaning up, additionally they voted in favor of more projects with Oreos, marshmallows, and frosting.

It has been in the bulletin, but I don't want you to miss this update: Hope Lutheran's Youth Ministry was awarded \$3,000 from the Endowment Fund Committee of the Southwester Minnesota Synod-ELCA. Sandy Joesphson had brought the opportunity to the attention of the Education Committee. A big thank you to Terri Myhre, Erin Roberts, Emily Hennen, and Angie DeVos for their time and efforts in the application process.

Although the council had a quieter schedule, we did hold an additional Zoom meeting led by **Peter Soli**, founder of *Dialog Works*. Peter shared some proposals to help **Hope Lutheran "Hope Together."** His organization was founded in October 2020 as a ministry focused on congregations navigating transitions, especially in the wake of COVID-19. The mission of Dialog Works is "to enlarge the capacity of faith leaders to establish and nurture sustainable ministries."

We anticipate voting in our October meeting on whether to move forward with Peter's guidance and support.

We're excited to announce that the **Building Committee** has been formed and will hold its first meeting following worship on **Sunday**, **October 19**. At the September Council meeting, the following members were approved to serve:

We are grateful for their willingness to serve and look forward to their insights as we assess the needs of our facilities. If you believe there is anything that needs to be addressed with the building in the future or have useful ideas to share regarding, please contact one of these building committee members.

I've been working to move forward on the situation regarding our **mission trip funds**. After consulting with multiple attorneys, I was able to connect with one in South Dakota who has kindly agreed to assist *pro bono*, aside from any incurred fees. Due to the defendant's connections, several attorneys I previously contacted were unable to take the case due to conflicts of interest.

I will be seeking **Council approval to proceed** once an engagement letter is presented. Please continue to pray for a just resolution to this matter.

There have been updates from the synod shared in regards to the candidate search. In August there were two candidates that received our paperwork and in the past month, Hope Lutheran's open call has been shared with 2 candidates, and our MSP has been shared with 1 candidate.

As we reflect on all that's happening in the life of our church—from youth ministry and council work to building updates and mission outreach—we're reminded of the importance of building on a strong foundation.


Just like our preschoolers learned with their marshmallow houses, the storms of life will come—but when we are rooted in Christ, in community, and in faith, we can stand firm.
